State of Oklahoma

Amtrak Service & Ridership

Amtrak serves Oklahoma with one shorter-distance train, the *Heartland Flyer* (daily Oklahoma City-Fort Worth, Texas).

During FY06 Amtrak served the following Oklahoma locations:

Procurement/Contracts

Amtrak expended \$1,654,075 for goods and services in Oklahoma in FY06. Most of this money was spent in Oklahoma City, \$1,318,984.

Employment

During fiscal year 2006, Amtrak employed 5 Oklahoma residents. Total wages of Amtrak employees living in Oklahoma were \$278,942 during this period.

State-Assisted Services

The *Heartland Flyer* has been funded by the state of Oklahoma since the train began service on June 14, 1999. Oklahoma has made capital upgrades to the BNSF tracks in Oklahoma, serving to increase speeds to 79 mph over segments of the route and reduce running times for the *Heartland Flyer*. Texas also began contributing to funding the service in Fiscal 2007.
